With the publication of the Athletic Training Rules and Regulations in the Pennsylvania Bulletin, it is truly an exciting time to be an athletic trainer in the commonwealth. It was a long road paved with the hard work of so many volunteers. Thank you to all who helped bring the Rules and Regulations to fruition.

In addition, I am very excited PATS has decided to return to sending out a Newsletter to our members. One area within PATS I have felt needed some improvement was the way we communicate with our membership. The strength of any organization is in its members. While many PATS members already actively contribute and participate in the betterment of PATS and the profession of Athletic Training, many more have frequently asked me how they can assist with PATS and be more involved in the profession they care so deeply for. I believe this newsletter will be a tremendous avenue to improving communication and involvement between all the members of PATS.

One of the things I am most proud of our profession is our commitment to service. Knowing how busy our lives are daily, I am consistently impressed how we as athletic trainers continue to give. I frequently see athletic trainers volunteering their time and contributing to our communities as well as promoting the profession. For instance, earlier this year, Tom Connors, Head Athletic Trainer at Dallas High School organized a Coaches vs Cancer Program in which funds were raised for cancer research. In addition, a northeast region member, Amy Zawadzki, became the PATS newly elected secretary. Congratulations Amy!

For the third straight year, the Northeast Pennsylvania Athletic Training Scholarship 5K Run /I Mile Walk took place during March at Kirby Park in Kingston, PA. Each of the four programs in the northeast region (East Stroudsburg University, King's College, Alvernia College, and Marywood University) contributed significantly with Alvernia providing the race brochures, King's providing the medical coverage and race set-up, Marywood covering registration, and ESU designing a healthy running display. All of the schools made health brochures to distribute to the runners. In addition, the Marywood Athletic Training Students did feet analyses on any runner/walker following the race free of charge. It was truly a top notch race. The \$2000 scholarship award winner was Evan M. Leibelsperger from ESU.

Two Junior King's College Athletic Training Students, Kristin Littzi and Corey Brubaker, received the awards for the best undergraduate research poster at the EATA and PATS annual conventions respectively.

In May, King's College and Marywood University teamed together and sent approximately 20 Athletic Training Students to provide medical coverage for the Special Olympics Eastern Spring Sectional at Kutztown University.

Geisinger Wyoming Valley continues to promote Athletic Training with multiple educational sessions and community events. This past year they provided medical coverage for local Triathalons, championships, and all-star events. They hosted health fairs, clinics, career days and offered the community health related presentations including ACL Prevention, Concussion Management, Performance Enhancement, and Stress fracture Diagnosis and Care.

As you can clearly see there are many great events, which have occurred over the past several months in the northeast region, however, I am confident I have unintentionally left out so much more. Now that the newsletter has been reintroduced, I ask the PATS northeast members to please keep me updated in regard to any athletic training related events (i.e. honors and awards local ATCs have received, research, ATC community service / outreach opportunities, significant service contributions (i.e. saved a life), athletic training month activities, etc.). Thank you for all your support and allowing me to continue to represent you in the northeast.

On to the activities: This past March, the 4th Annual PATS Athletic Trainer River Run was a huge success once again, raising over \$2,500! For those who may not be aware, the PATS Athletic Trainer River Run is a 5K and I mile fun run that generates revenue to fund an annual \$2,000 scholarship to an athletic training student from one of the four curriculum programs in the SW region: California University of PA, Duquesne University, University of Pittsburgh, and Waynesburg University. This event is spearheaded through the outstanding hard work of the athletic training staff at UPMC Sports Medicine. Further, Ms. Pagnotta was one of two chosen athletic training students from District 2 to attend the 2007 Athletic Training Student Leadership Workshop in Fort Lauderdale, Fl this past May. A sincere congratulation goes out to Kelly.

Once again, March, which just happens to be National Athletic Training Month, was a great month for the SW region. The 2007 NATA Public Relations Contest awarded two SW groups this year. As always, the people involved in the athletic training profession are working hard to improve the profession and the opportunities for individuals that follow them. Both certified and athletic training students in the North Central region were very busy the last few months.

The region hosted two different golf tournaments with proceeds benefiting the profession. Susquehanna Health's Sports Medicine Center held it's 16th Annual Coaches Golf Tournament organized by Mike Ludwikowski, ATC, Workshop Director/Coordinator of Outreach Athletic Training Services. Over 100 golfers enjoyed a round of golf, lunch, raffles and an awards ceremony at the White Deer Golf Challenge Course in Allenwood, PA. Students from both Penn State and Lock Haven University participated in the Inaugural 2007 PATS Quiz Bowl. Amanda Cox, Kyle Harris, and Sarah McDevitt from Lock Haven University were the winners of this competition. Congratulations to all that participated.

The I7th Annual Athletic Training Students' Basic Workshop was held at Susquehanna Health's Williamsport Hospital & Medical Center Campus from July 9-13. The course is designed for high school students who have demonstrated a serious and active interest in sports medicine and athletic training. Twenty-six campers representing II area high schools were in attendance. Camp activities included instruction on taping techniques, educational games, CPR certification, and lectures on various topics athletic training topics. Mindy Smith, ATC stated, "The kids loved the human cadaver lab experience at Lock Haven University and enjoyed a week of team competition in educational games developed by the staff. The week ended with a Survivor style team challenge as well as a Sports Medicine version of Jeopardy!" loe lezzi MS, ATC

Joe has been a Certified Athletic Trainer for 32 years. He received his undergraduate degree from West Chester University and his Master's degree from California University of Pennsylvania. Joe was the head athletic trainer at Cheyney University, Philadelphia University, and Downingtown High School. He has been employed at Downingtown High School since 1988. He was also employed at Paoli Orthopedic and Rehabilitation. He is most proud to have been involved in 5 NCAA Final Fours and 17 PIAA State Championships.

Joe had the opportunity to work for two weeks at the U.S. Olympic Training Center. That experience earned him time with Olympic teams at the Olympic Festival, World University Games, and the Goodwill games in Moscow.

Joe lezzi has been involved in many leadership roles within our profession. He served on the PATS Board of Directors for eight years; serving as Eastern Representative, President Elect, President, and Past President. During his tenure as President, Joe introduced changes in the Pennsylvania Law and initiated the start of the new law to be directly under the Medical Practice Act. 


